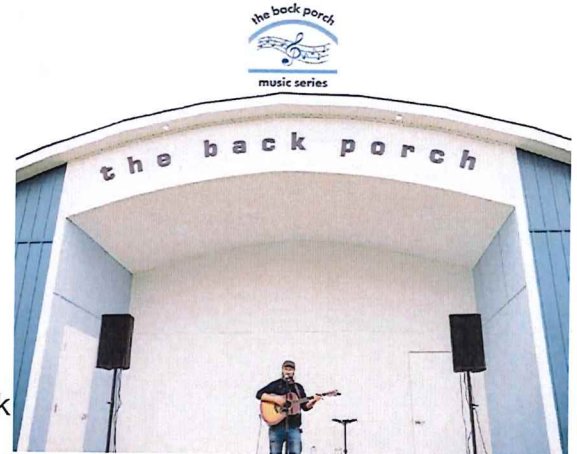
BACK PORCH MUSIC SERIES
